Proceeds from the Luncheon will help the American Conference on Diversity bring to Hudson County programs that promote understanding and respect among all races, religions and cultures.

The Hudson County Chapter supports the following Youth Leadership Institute Programs:

Lead for Diversity, a residential Peer Leadership Program helping youth leaders to examine personal, cultural, and institutional prejudices, with the goals of identifying and breaking down barriers and stereotypes. After participating in Lead for Diversity, empowered student leaders return to their schools to put the ideals they have learned in to practice by developing and implementing Action Plans aimed to reduce bias and prejudice in their schools.

Manytown, one-day Regional Youth Leadership Forums, which bring together Lead for Diversity Delegates and other high school's students from different communities to share, discuss, and learn from specialists on a variety of student selected topics in a culturally diverse learning environment.

School Swap, a curriculum where a group of students from one school can experience a day in the life of students from a demographically different school. The experiences of high school students are greatly affected by the size of the school, its geographic location, socioeconomic make-up, and student, faculty, and staff diversity. The goal of School Swap is for students to begin dialogue on these differences and their root causes, as well as to find, perhaps unexpectedly, common ground.

Jersey City Poster Art Contest, an annual art contest open to Jersey City high school students. Students artistically interpret the chapter board selected theme. The 2010 theme is "Placing my stamp on the world."
